Where? Cochabamba, population nearly one million, is a city in central Bolivia, located in a valley in the Andes mountain range. It is the capital of the Cochabamba Department (province) and the fourth largest city in Bolivia.

When? The Huttons have volunteered with CBM in Bolivia since fall 2013. They were appointed as CBM Global Field Staff in April 2015 and, after raising support, arrived back in Bolivia in October, 2015.

What? The Huttons provide support and mentorship to staff and projects in conjunction with CBM's partners, the Bolivian Baptist Union (UBB) and its development arm OBADES. They seek to get churches involved with strategic community development projects as well as expanding the seminary's capacity to train effective leaders. Another focus is improving accessibility to theological resources and other vital information which can be challenging for Bolivians to access. (cbm.org)

OBADES is committed to generating sustainable community development and Kallie helps OBADES work through changes in their administrative processes required by the Bolivian government and recommended by CBM. Tim consults with the school administration of two seminaries to improve library organizational structure, policies, technology, and staff training. He also helps implement a strategic vision and collection development policy he created for the library of Carachipampa Christian School (CCS), an international K-12 non-profit organization providing a North American standard of education to children of international aid and ministry workers as well as many Bolivians. This will ensure the CCS library meets accreditation standards. Tim finds his librarian trade and his skills in non-profit management and project proposals are directly transferable to the development initiatives within the CBM/Bolivian partnership (timandkallie.com)

Kallie writes: "Last week we had an opportunity to participate in a daylong retreat with the key leaders from the Bolivian Baptist Union, Seminary, OBADES, the Integral Mission Center, and some of their subdivisions.
